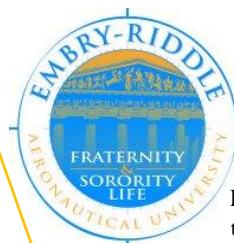

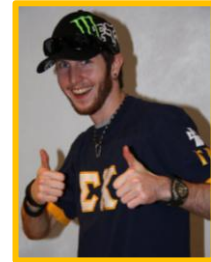

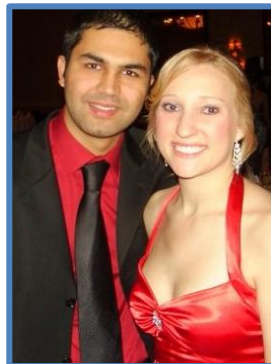


Where are they now? Catch up with alumni and see what they have been up to!

It is hard to believe it has been 40 years since that day and that there are now over 700 brothers of Eta Iota. Thank all of you for living up to our original goal of sharing our brotherhood with men committed to the betterment of character, campus and community. Oh yeah, and with a whole lot of partying in-between.

Brother Hugh Mills was the keynote speaker that night and spoke about his experiences in the military and at Embry-Riddle, and how Sigma Chi significantly affected his life.



Ramano Sprueil gave his annual Torrisi scholarship and awarded Jim Baldyga with 1st place and Trevor Simms with 2nd. Founder's awards were also presented to the Brother who best lives up to the ideals of each of those significant men. They were Thomas Cowan Bell (Trevor Simms), James Parks Caldwell (Taylor Quackenbush), Daniel William Cooper (David Cruz), Isaac M. Jordan (Jeremiah Poff), William Lewis Lockwood (Rick Lapp), Benjamin Piatt Runkle (Josh Chancey), and Franklin Howard Scobey (Jonny Jacobs). The 1st Norman Shield Award was also given to Brother Jim Baldyga.



Throughout the course of the weekend, a lot of money was also raised for the Chapter. At Saturday's dinner, Brothers participated in a 50/50 raffle – out of that, \$1250 was raised for the active chapter! House Corp was also collected donations all weekend. Seth Downs was seen walking around with a thermometer to be colored in as the \$20,000 donation goal got closer and closer. He filled the thermometer with red, whenever anyone either gave money on the spot or pledged to give a donation, in the form of joining the 1855 Club by making monthly donations; if someone pledged to give \$41.67 a month, he would count that as \$500 (annual total) on the thermometer. Currently House Corp has made \$11,000 this month, with annual

1855 membership and pledges to donate going a little over \$20,000. The 1855 membership went from 49 members to 82 and there 8 more alumni that have pledged to join.



All in all, Brothers from the past 40 years definitely enjoyed themselves a little less than a month ago as they joined together to celebrate Eta Iota's 40th Birthday.

The celebration even got some great press too! James Ahrens, the 40th Birthday coordinator, published an

Sigma Chi Celebrates 40 Years at Embry-Riddle

Over 300 alumni, guests, and active chapter members descended on Daytona Beach from March 31 to April 3rd for 4 days celebrating the 40th Birthday Party for the Eta Iota Chapter of Sigma Chi at Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University in Daytona Beach, Florida. The chapter was founded March 6th, 1971 and has initiated over 800 brothers since then.

Our festivities started on Thursday with a tour of the campus and a reception hosted by the Alumni Association office. Then on Friday President Johnson and Dan Montplaisir joined 30 brothers for a golf tournament at Spruce Creek Golf Club.

The party was cranked up later Friday with a giant BBQ hosted at the Sigma Chi fraternity house at 520 S. Ridgewood Ave. Over 300 people enjoyed seeing each other, sharing stories, and rocking out to the band Yummy!

The reason for the annual birthday party is for alumni to return for the Eta Iota House Corporation annual meeting to support the fraternity house. Topics included the future of the house, fund raising, and support of the active chapter.

By Saturday night everyone was ready to put on their Hawaiian Shirts and Leis for the big Parrothead Cocktail party with music by Skip "Steel Daddy" Lilly. Then everyone feasted on the Margaritaville Buffett Buffet

prepared by our own Hayden Haddox and enjoyed listening to JD Spradlin from Radio Margaritaville.

Our guest speaker for the evening was Significant Sig Hugh Mills '74 who flew the Hughes OH-6 Cayuse during 2 tours in Vietnam. Hugh was shot down sixteen times, wounded three times, and earned numerous decorations for valor, including three Silver Stars, four Distinguished Flying Crosses, and three Bronze Stars with V devices.

Our Sweetheart Michelle Rodio '11 handed out several awards and was serenaded by over 200 brothers singing the Sweetheart of Sigma Chi song. And Brother Ramano Sprueil '94 handed out 2 scholarships to deserving brothers.

Everything wrapped up on Sunday with a huge chapter meeting with brothers spanning 40 years sharing the bonds of brotherhood.
