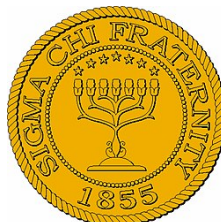




Eta Iota Alumni News Letter September

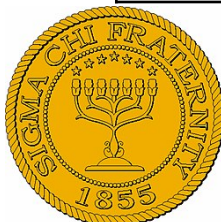

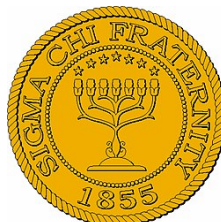

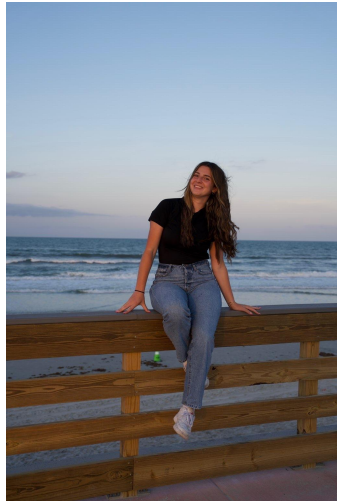
Another Peterson For The Eta Iota Chapter

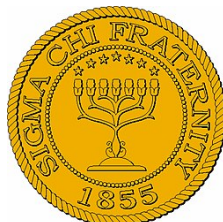




The Sweetheart of Sigma Chi

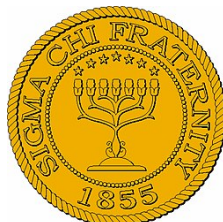


The Eta Iota Chapter is Welcomed into the 50k Club
